She came to this role with not only coaching experience and experience as Sheehan's athletic director, but also with service as the co-director, league director, coach and counselor at the Basketball Factory Camp. Further, her coaching credits include the University of New Haven Women's team, the Sheehan Varsity Girls, the CT Starters AAU team where she earned the coach's award, and the Ulbrich Travel team.
