Sharon spent her early career with the Hyatt group before pursuing endeavors closer to home to raise her two children, Arianna and Dimitri with her husband, Eddie.

Sharon stayed close to the hospitality industry even while raising her children. She worked at various positions, including restaurant manager at Yankee Silversmith, sales manager at Pavilion Catering, and food and beverage director at Wallingford Country Club. She also used her expertise as she volunteered at her children's school instituting the Cultural and Diversity Day Festival at Moses Y. Beach, potentially sparking her teaching career. Sharon earned certifications in family and consumer sciences and in vocational food service and embarked on a highly successful career teaching first at Sheehan and then at Lyman Hall where she is currently.

In her role as teacher of culinary arts, Sharon has earned multiple accolades, all while launching students into successful careers and teaching them the importance of giving back.
