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### Time Management

- I think of time management differently.

- Time is invisible and untouchable, meaning that we need some way to represent it to give it some structure. I create ways to make it visible for students like calendars, to do lists, GANTT charts and push notifications.
- I help students figure out what will work best for them.







## **Classroom Strategies**

- -When we make something difficult, we remember it better.
  - Repeated teaching over days. Not one and done.
- Spiraling-As you introduce new information, you spiral back to previous information.
- Homework reinforcement




#### Strategy/Desirable Difficulty: Test Yourself

- One of the best study practices (Dunlosky et al. 2013)

#### Improve Associations by making Meaningful Connections

- -Help students learn to self cue/reming of previously covered content or meaningful information
- -This reminds me of something from X. Why?
- -Encourage individualized connections with prior knowledge, personal interstate or goals.
- -How does this relate to something they already have clear connections to?
- -How does this content or task relate to a student's post graduation goals?



#### Strategies

- Improve Clarity: Projects vs Tasks
- Project is a final product
- Task is one of many steps you need to take to eventually finish a project.
- Projects need to be broken down into tasks.
- Teach students how to break down projects into tasks. It is a skill they need to learn.
