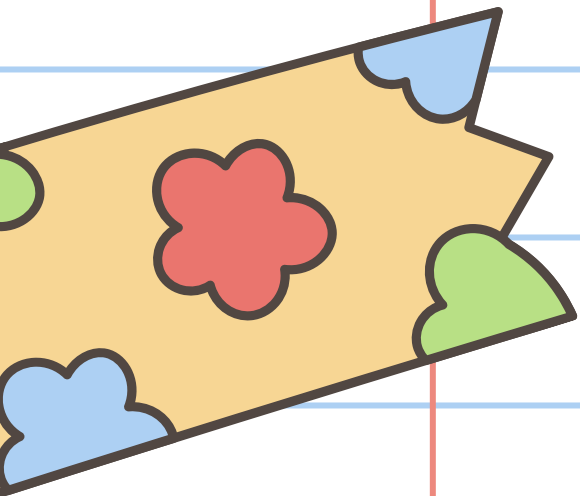
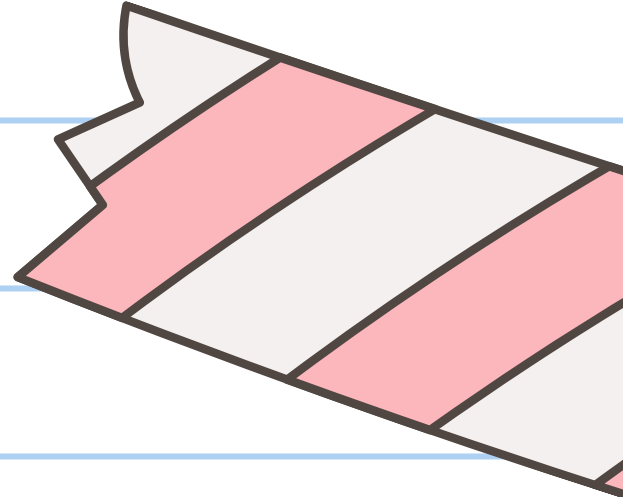
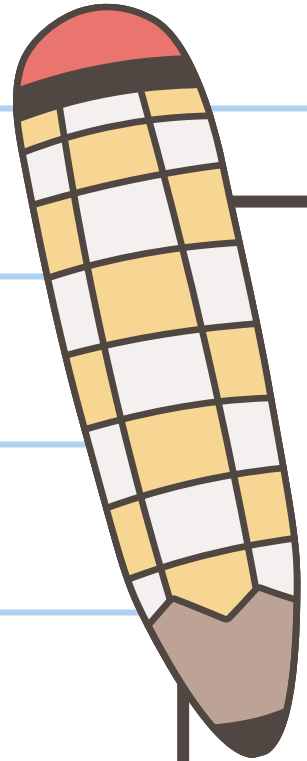


What is IMSE?

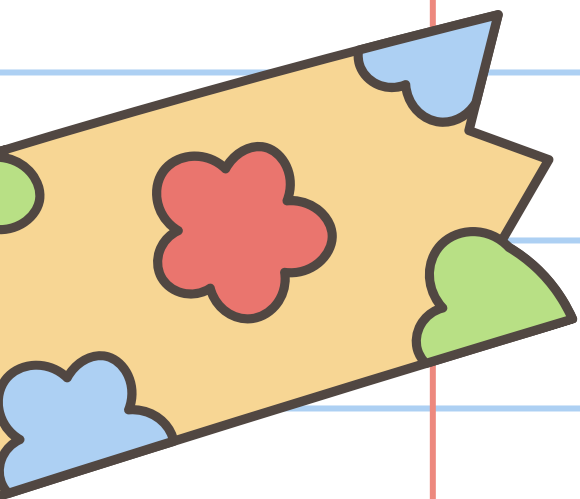
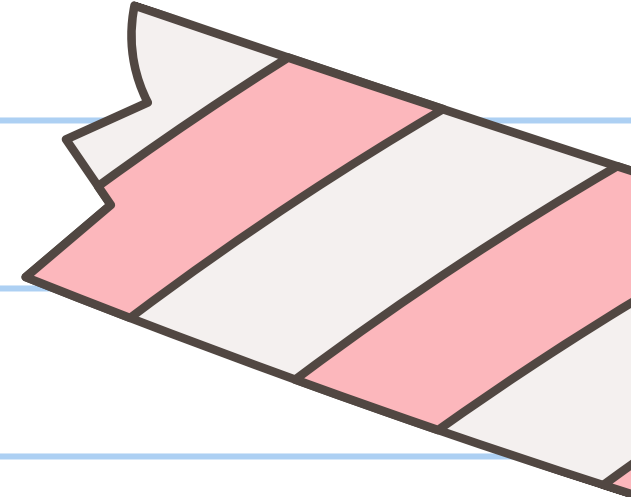
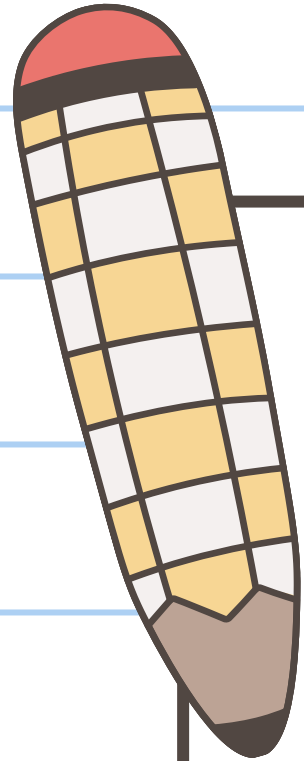
- Structured, explicit phonics instruction
- Multi-sensory approach to literacy
- Supports all learners, especially striving readers
- Builds phonemic awareness, decoding, and spelling skills

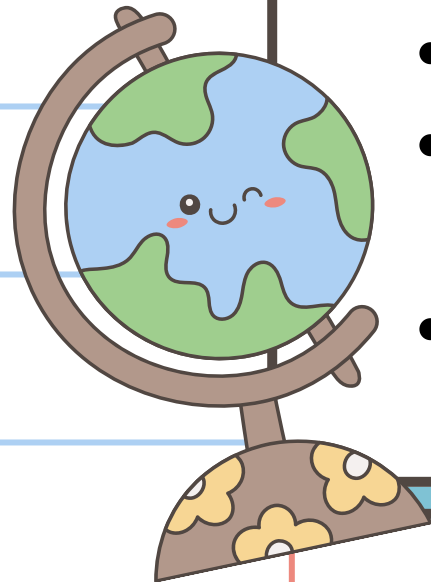
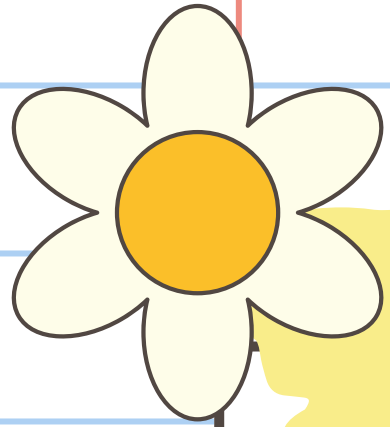
- Use IMSE materials and routines to reinforce skills
